# City of Bonner Springs Overview

Bonner Springs is a vibrant, pro-development community with a growing population of 7,606 located on the western edge of the Kansas City metropolitan area. The city limits is comprised of eighteen square miles and encompasses three counties - Wyandotte, Johnson and Leavenworth. The majority of the City is located in southwest Wyandotte County. It is generally bounded by Kansas City, Kansas to the north and east, Edwardsville to the east, Shawnee to the south, and Leavenworth County to the north and west.

Bonner Springs operates with a Mayor-Council-Manager form of government with a full time professional City Manager. In conjunction with other special units of local government, Bonner Springs provides a full range of urban services to its citizens. The City provides EMS, fire and police services with up-to-date, well equipped departments and an ISO Fire Protection Rating of 5 in the majority of the City. The City provides other services consisting of a Library, Public Transportation System, Senior Citizen Center, Public Works Department, Parks and Recreation Department and Utilities Department.

Public water service and sanitary sewer service are owned and operated by the City. The water plant produces and distributes an average of 1.15 million gallons of water each day. The 1.4 mgd wastewater treatment plant built in 1985 is operating at approximately 55% capacity.

Bonner Springs students attend the Bonner Springs-Edwardsville Unified School District 204. The school district is comprised of Bonner Springs Elementary School, Edwardsville Elementary School, Delaware Ridge Elementary School, Robert E. Clark Middle School and Bonner Springs High School.

The City contracts with the Unified Government of Wyandotte County/Kansas City Kansas for solid waste disposal provided by Deffenbaugh Industries. Electric power is supplied by Westar Energy and Kansas City Power and Light, natural gas by Atmos Energy, phone service by AT&T, cable TV by Time Warner Cable, several cellular phone companies and Internet providers.

The 2016 adopted budget of the City of Bonner Springs is \$17,771,543 and the City's assessed value is \$69,483,884. Of the City's 1.75% sales tax, .75% is dedicated for emergency services capital items, city-wide capital improvements, and a \$3.5 million public library that opened in July 2009.
